INDEX TO CLASSES

HUNTER DIVISION

Hunter Courses: Unless otherwise stated, all hunter classes are to be judged on performance, manners, way of going and soundness. Manners and suitability to be emphasized in Children's and Adult Amateur classes. In handy classes obstacles will simulate those found in trappy hunting country, horses may be required to trot over an obstacle toward the end of the course and may be asked to lead over one obstacle.

Marshall & Sterling League: The Fall Classic and Fall Preview points will count towards the 2007 season. Riders and Horses must be members for points to count.

Hunter/Equitation Schooling: open to all horses as an opportunity to school over the hunter/equitation jumps in the show rings during specified times on the day before the horse show starts and, if time permits, at the end of each show day at management's discretion. Attire may be informal, boots and breeches or chaps with a shoe or paddock boot with a distinct heel (no tennis shoes). Protective headgear is mandatory. **All hunters and/or equitation horses will be required to pay a one time \$35 hunter/equitation fee.**

Orders of Go: - Classes in the hunter rings will have specific start and finish times for each class, and these times will be adhered to, posted orders may be imposed at any time. Horses who have not shown by that time will not be allowed to show. All entries must be made by 5:00pm.

HUNTER BREEDING DIVISION

Entry Fee - \$25 Per Class

Open to horses only. In all hunter breeding classes, horses to be judged on conformation, quality, soundness, substance, and suitability to become a show hunter. Horses are to jog and be judged on way of going. Horses to be moved on the line. The Best Young Horse is open only to first and second place finishers from the other Hunter Breeding Classes offered. Special awards will be presented to the Champion and Reserve Champion Best Young Horse.

Equitation classes are to be judged on seat, hands, legs, control of mount, and suitability. Hunter and pleasure classes judged on performance, soundness, and suitability. Manners emphasized. No in and outs.

No in and outs.

Open to small, medium and large ponies ridden by a child under 18 years of age. To be judged on performance and soundness, but ponies will not be jogged. Please see below for heights and enter accordingly, ponies may cross enter between the 2 warm-up classes.

JUMPER DIVISION

In all jumper classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. For other ties, time in the first round will decide between tied horses. Horses must be recorded with the Federation in order to be eligible to compete in jumper classes offering prize money at competitions, which offer \$2,500 or more in the jumper division.

Jumper Nominating Fee:

Horses entered in any jumper class set below 1.30M MUST pay a \$50 Low-Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee.

Horses entered in jumper class set at 1.30M or above MUST pay a \$100 Hi-Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee. These horses must be recorded with the USEF.

Jumper Nominating Fee Refund Policy:

Jumper Nominating Fee refund schedule will be as follows: Before the Closing Date of Entries – 100%; After The Closing Date but before Start of Show – 50%. After the show starts there will be no refunds.

Poling:

Poling and the use of Offsets **ARE NOT** permitted at any time, anywhere on the show ground.

Martingales and Draw Reins:

In any jumper class offering prize money of \$1,000 to \$4,999, only standing martingales or running martingales used in the conventional manner, are permitted. In any class offering prize money of \$5,000 or more, and all classes restricted to young horses, only running martingales, used in the conventional manner, are permitted. Draw reins may only be used when schooling or in classes offering less than \$1,000.

Whips:

Competitors are prohibited from using a whip that is longer than 30" (75cm) while in the process of jumping or schooling over fences. A rider may not carry more than one whip. Whips that are weighted at the end are prohibited at any time.

Attire:

Management may allow competitors to compete without riding coats. If a riding coat is not worn, riders must wear a shirt with a collar or a choker, neatly tucked into riding breeches. A windbreaker or raincoat may be worn if conditions require.

Jumper Changes:

Jumper changes must be made by 5:00pm the day prior to the class to avoid being charged a post entry penalty. Changes made after this time will be charged the post entry penalty of \$10 per class, and may be required to work first in the order of go. ***Exhibitors are encouraged to enter the classes in which they wish to compete on their entry blank, as adds may not be accepted for a class scheduled on that same day.***

Order of Go:

Orders for the main Jumper ring will be drawn and rotated except Special Classes. Classes in the Jumper rings will have specific starting times for each class and these times will be strictly adhered to. Orders and start times will be posted by 7:00pm each night on www.leghorseshows.com.

Footing:

All rings are sand with decomposed granite base.

Time Allowed: The speed at which time allowed will be calculated will be 360 yards per minute for Pony Jumpers, and 382 yards per minute (350 meters per minute) for all other rated jumpers.

USEF JP119 (effective April 1, 2005) – If a specific height is used in lieu of a Level, either feet and inches or metric units may be used; however, in all cases a minimum of 50% of the obstacles in the first round must be set at the height indicated and the spreads must be set in conformance with the USEF level chart. Obstacles in the first round (with the exception of the first obstacle and those in combinations, which may be lower) may not vary by more than 2" (5cm) in height from the class height indicated in the prize list.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the USEF and/or the competition any use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the USEF. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of USEF rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the USEF must be filed in New York State. See Art. 1502.5.

2. **Life, senior active, and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above, and Combined Driving Competitions at the advanced level, /dressage, Reining, and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Reining Competitions, Dressage Competitions, and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20.00 non-member registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: 1) Leadline; 2) Exhibitions; 3) Games and Races; and 4) Classes for 4-H Members; 5) walk/trot and academy classes (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA endorsed Reining Competitions. Also exempted from this requirement are citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 8) USEA beginner novice division; and 9) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding Classes (See GR807.4 of the Federation Rules).**

3. STABLING: Stalls, whether occupied by horses, feed, or tack, will be available for \$150 each. First bedding will NOT be included. Permanent stalls are 10' x 12' with sliding doors, Portable stalls, if utilized are 9'6" x 9'6" canvas with doors. Stalls received after the closing date of entries will be \$175 each.

4. ENTRY PROCEDURES:

a. For each horse entered, send a \$50 Entry Deposit Fee, the appropriate nominating fees, along with your \$150 Stall Fee (if a stall is needed). Stalls received after the closing date of entries will be \$175 each. Send with your completely filled out entry blank on or before the closing date of entries. Entries may be returned if any of the above is incomplete.

b. Bring a check for the remainder of your fees to the show. No numbers will be issued without full payment, or a signed open check may be left.

c. If entry blanks are postmarked on or before the closing date of entries and are properly filled out the Entry Deposit Fee will be credited to the entries due.

d. LATE ENTRIES AND/OR IMPROPER ENTRIES WILL FORFEIT THE ENTRY DEPOSIT FEE!! .

e. DO NOT make entries from the time schedule. Consult the index to classes. **Time schedules are subject to change after the close of entries. Therefore, upon arrival at the show, be sure to check the time schedule in the Show Office.**

f. Jumper Nominating Fee:

Horses entered in any jumper class set below 1.30M MUST pay a \$50 Low-Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee.

Horses entered in any Jumper class set at 1.30M or higher MUST pay a \$100 Hi-Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee.

g. Hunter/Equitation Showing Fee:

Horses entered in any Hunter of Equitation class MUST pay a \$35 showing fee.

h. Equitation Entries: Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they are officially entered on. If the rider wishes to change horses for an equitation class, he/she may do so without penalty; however, the proper paperwork must be completed in the horse show office prior to the class. Exhibitors who enter an equitation class on one horse and ride or wear another horse's number will be charged on both horses. Paperwork must be done in the horse show office to avoid this penalty.

5. ENTRIES CLOSE: **Tuesday August 21, 2007**

6. POST ENTRIES: After a horse's entry number has been picked up, the post entry charge of \$10 per class will apply with the exception of jumper declarations made by 5:00pm the day prior to the class, providing that they have noted their sections on their entry blanks. **Entries must be made the day prior to the day the class is being held, entries will not be accepted, in any ring, the day the class is being held.** All entries received after closing date will pay a Late Fee of \$50 in addition to post entry charges. Horses and/or riders who go in a class without entering will be charged \$20 extra.

7. SCRATCHES/CHANGES (without the official Show Vet Certificate)

1. Scratch Division – full credit less \$25 scratch fee

2. Scratch class – full credit less \$10 scratch fee

3. Show scratch – \$50

4. Scratches that are made the same day as the class is being held will not receive credit.

5. There is no charge for exhibitors changing horses in an equitation class (see equitation entries for additional information).

8. REFUNDS: Before the closing date of entries full refunds will be given. After the closing date of entries, ENTRY DEPOSIT FEES AND STALL FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED. After the show starts, with official show vets certificate only, full refunds will be given less a \$50 per horse "scratch fee", stall fees, and fees for classes already held prior to notification, whether exhibited in or not. If a division entry fee has to be pro-rated

for a vet slip refund, the individual classes entered will be surcharged \$10 for each class in which the horse competed, in addition to the \$50 "scratch fee".

10. SUBSTITUTIONS: With a vet certificate, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse. There will be a \$50 office charge. Any added or scratched classes will be treated as noted above.

11. PRIZES: All class winners will receive a trophy and ribbons through 8th place in addition to any prize money. Prize money will pay to 5th place; 30%, 25%, 20%, 15%, 10%. Excepting Special Classes - see individual class specifications. Prize money checks will be made to the owner listed on the entry and will be mailed within 30 days of the show. NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE MAILED UNLESS THE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OF THE OWNER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY BLANK.

12. MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold High Prairie Farms, The Colorado Horse Park, The Colorado Fall Series, The Colorado Hunter Jumper Association, and Langer Equestrian Group, Inc. harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted unless the entry blank is signed by a parent or guardian.

13. MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or rising out of or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management with their decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, change any course, cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; change rings or rotate judges; change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Once sections are combined, they will not be un-combined unless there 8 entries in each section on the morning of the first class.

14. TRAILER INS: There will be a \$25 per day grounds fee for horses trailing in and not requiring stalls.

15. FEED AND BEDDING: Hay, grain and bedding will be available at the Horse Show. The Colorado Horse Park is the exclusive feed/shavings concessionaire. Products will be sold at market prices. To insure prompt delivery please pre-order, credit cards are not accepted. Those exhibitors who do not pre-order must present an open check to the feed office upon arrival. The feed office phone number is 303.841.3892. **Deliveries from outside feed companies will not be allowed.**

16. RV PARKING: There are a limited number of RV Hookups at the Colorado Horse Park. They will be \$175 per show. Reservations must be made on the entry blanks. The closest campgrounds: Castlerock KOA - 6527 So. I-25 - Castlerock, Colorado - (303) 681-3169

17. PADDOCKS: Turnout paddocks are on a first-reserved basis and must be paid for in advance on your entry blank, \$175 per week. Paddocks are steel pipe, dimensions approximately 24' by 24'. Lock and chain are not provided for paddocks.

18. RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure.

All returned checks will be charged an additional 10% penalty (minimum \$25).

Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into the USEF for further disciplinary action.

19. CLOSED RINGS: Horses are not permitted in arenas when a course is set or in the process of being set for an upcoming class.

20. SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Please be advised that starters have authority, as agents of management, to scratch riders who do not follow USEF schooling rules. We are serious about the rules for the schooling areas.

21. COURSES: Courses may consist of any combination of the following; Brush, Gate, Oxers, Post and Rails, Water, Liverpool's, Ditch, Walls, Panels, Banks and Coops. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to adjust fence heights or spreads in Jumper classes as competition warrants.

22. CONFLICTS: It is the intention of management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters so that they will not hold up a class. Starters have the authority from management to scratch riders who are not timely.

23. DOGS: All dogs on the show grounds must be leashed at all times. No dogs are allowed in stable area, in or around arenas or other areas, or in exterior RV areas without leashes. Horse show management has employed the services of an animal control officer and any dogs found unleashed will immediately be sent to Douglas County Animal Control, and the Colorado Humane Society. A fee will be required to release any dog taken into custody.

Dogs are a serious safety problem at Horse Shows. All exhibitors should be advised that this show is SERIOUS about loose dogs being a nuisance at events and we encourage all persons to keep their dogs leashed, for their safety ... and the safety of others.

24. ABUSE: Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or penalties. Excessive abuse includes, but is not limited to, excessive use of the whip, use of the whip in front of the horses shoulder.

25. POLING: Poling and the use of offsets **ARE NOT** permitted at any time, anywhere on the show grounds.

26. MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste. Bio Hazardous Medical Waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

27. GOLF CARTS: Carts may be reserved in advance by calling: Discount Golf Cars, Inc. – (303)744-3494. Renters must be 18 years old and must sign a damage waiver. A \$200 cleaning and damage deposit is required ONCE RENTED, GOLF CARTS REMAIN WITH THE RENTER AND ARE THAT RENTER'S RESPONSIBILITY. **Golf carts may be operated by licensed drivers only.**

28. DESIGNATED PARKING

All trainers with ten or more horses entered will be issued passes to park in the T-Lot. These passes will be issued on a first come first served basis, once the T-Lot is full additional parking will be in the exhibitor parking lot. Absolutely no cars or trailers may be parked in the stable area except during loading and un-loading. Cars or trailers left unattended in the stable are will be subject to towing at the owner's expense. Vehicle traffic is a safety issue that we take very seriously. Disabled parking passes are available at no charge in the horse show office, please call ahead in order to help us facilitate your entrance to the horse show grounds 303.841.7461.

29. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

30. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Please be advised that alcoholic beverages in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds.

31. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: All exhibitors are required to wear properly fitting protective headgear while jumping on the competition grounds. All Junior riders must wear properly fitting protective headgear passing or surpassing current applicable ASTM/SEI standards with harness secured while riding anywhere on the competition grounds. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor, to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards and is properly fitted and in good condition. U.S.E.F, the Show Committee, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance.

33. DIRECTIONS TO THE COLORADO HORSE PARK:

From Interstate 25: Turn east on Colorado 470 – about 4 miles to Route 83, also known as Parker Road. Go South, through the town of Parker. Continue until you pass The Pinery on your left. The Horse Park property begins at white fence just south of gate to The Pinery. DO NOT TURN INTO HIGH PRAIRIE. Continue through the light at High Prairie Drive and go to the next light, which is Bayou Gulch Road. Turn left, pass Ponderosa High School, and you will see the show entrance on your left.

From Interstate 70, Eastbound: Take Colorado 470 (this exit occurs just as you have almost ended your descent through the foothills until you reach Route 83 or Parker Road. Then follow directions listed above.

From Interstate 70, Westbound: Turn west on Route 86, just west of Limon. Go to Franktown intersection and turn north (left) at Route 83 or Parker Road. Travel approximately four miles and turn right on Bayou Gulch Road. The Horse Park will be on your left.
