Circuit Preview and Circuit Opener the Adult Amateur Hunters will show in Hunter Ring 2. Rocky Mt. Classic and Colorado Summer Classic the Children's Hunters will show in Ring 2.

Circuit Preview and Circuit Opener the order will be; Small, Medium, Large, Rocky Mt. Classic and Summer Classic the order will be Large, Medium, Small.

# INDEX TO CLASSES

## HUNTER DIVISION

Unless otherwise stated, all hunter classes are to be judged on performance and soundness. In **Handy Classes** obstacles will simulate those found in trappy hunting country, horses may be required to trot over an obstacle and may be asked to lead over one obstacle.

**HUNTER SCHOOLING** will be allowed in the designated hunter rings the day prior to the start of the show. At the course designers discretion hunter rings may be open for schooling after the completion of the show day. Hunter nominating fees include schooling at no charge. In the rated hunter rings a one-minute gate will be enforced and trainer conflicts will not be allowed to delay a ring.

**ORDERS OF GO** – Classes in the hunter rings will have specific start and finish times for each class, and these times will be strictly adhered to, posted orders may be imposed at any time. Horses who have not shown by that time will not be allowed to show. All entries must be made by 5:00pm (or ½ hour after the last class, whichever occurs first) the day prior to the class.

## HUNTER BREEDING DIVISION

**Entry Fee - \$25 Per Class**

*The hunter breeding classes at the Circuit Opener, Rocky Mountain Classic, and Summer Classic will be offered as two judge sections, with two sets of awards being given and two sets of points.*

Open to horses only. In all hunter breeding classes, horses to be judged on conformation, quality, soundness, substance, and suitability to become a show hunter. Horses are to jog and be judged on way of going. Horses to be moved on the line. The Best Young Horse is open only to first and second place finishers from the other Hunter Breeding Classes offered. Special awards will be presented to the Champion and Reserve Champion Best Young Horse.

## 2008 CIRCUIT AWARDS

Circuit champion awards will be presented at the conclusion of the Colorado Summer Circuit to those riders/horses accumulating the most points (\*\*jumpers – accumulated prize money) throughout the four weeks of horse shows in the categories listed above. The Parade of Champions will take place in the Grand Prix Ring Prior to the Grand Prix on Saturday July 28th (approximately 3:30). **The awards presentation will be for champion only**, reserve champions may pick up their ribbons in the show office. Standings will be updated each week and posted at the show office and on the horse show website – [www.leghorseshow.com](http://www.leghorseshow.com). Horses should be presented in hand, wearing bridles. All champions are strongly encouraged to attend. It is the responsibility of the individual to check point standings and pick up their awards. **Circuit awards will not be mailed.**

## LEADING OPEN JUMPER RIDER

This award will be given to the jumper rider who earns the most prize money in the Open Jumper Classics (held each week), The Speed Derby (weeks 2 and 4) The High Prairie Grand Prix, The Rocky Mountain Grand Prix, and The Grand Prix of Denver. For riders with multiple horses in a particular class, only the prize money on the highest placed horse in that class will count towards the award.

# JUMPER DIVISION

In all jumper classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. For other ties, time in the first round will decide between tied horses unless otherwise stated.

**Jumper Nominating Fee:**

Horses entered in any jumper class that does not offer prize money MUST pay a \$50 Low-Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee.

Horses entered in any Modified, Open, Junior, or Amateur Owner Jumper class MUST pay a \$125 Hi-Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee. **These horses must be recorded with the USEF.** GRANDPRIX horses must include an additional \$100 Grand prix Nominating Fee. Horses entered in the Grand prix ONLY are exempt from paying the JNF, but they must send the Grand prix Nominating Fee of \$100.

**Jumper Nominating Fee Refund Policy:**

Jumper Nominating Fee refund schedule will be as follows: Before the Closing Date of Entries - 100%; After The Closing Date but before Start of Show - 50%. After the show starts there will be no refunds.

**Poling:**

Poling and the use of Offsets **ARE NOT** permitted at any time, anywhere on the show grounds, during the Summer Circuit.

**Martingales and Draw Reins:**

In any jumper class offering prize money of \$1,000 to \$4,999, only standing martingales or running martingales used in the conventional manner, are permitted. In any class offering prize money of \$5,000 or more, and all classes restricted to young horses, only running martingales, used in the conventional manner, are permitted. Draw reins may only be used when schooling or in classes offering less than \$1,000.

**Whips:**

Competitors are prohibited from using a whip that is longer than 30" (75cm) while in the process of jumping or schooling over fences. A rider may not carry more than one whip. Whips that are weighted at the end are prohibited at any time.

**Attire:**

Management may allow competitors to compete without riding coats. If a riding coat is not worn, riders must wear a shirt with a collar or a choker, neatly tucked into riding breeches. A windbreaker or raincoat may be worn if conditions require.

**Jumper Changes:**

Jumper changes must be made by 5:00pm or 1/2 hour after the last jumper class (whichever occurs first) to avoid being charged a post entry penalty. Changes made after this time will be charged the post entry penalty of \$10 per class, and may be required to work first in the order of go. **Exhibitors are encouraged to enter the classes in which they wish to compete on their entry blank, as adds will not be accepted for a class scheduled on that same day.**

**Order of Go:**

Orders for the Main Jumper ring will be drawn and rotated except Special Classes. Classes in the Main Jumper Ring (Derby Field or Grand Prix Ring) will have specific starting times for each horse and these times will be adhered to as closely as possible.

Each jumper class in Jumper Ring 2 will have a start and finish time. Sign-up sheets will be available at the horse show office daily by 7:00am, or at the back gate once the ring has begun. Riders who sign up for a time must be ready to enter the ring at that time.

**Riders who do not sign up for a time or who do not make their scheduled time may be allowed to show at the discretion of the Starter if a time slot is available.** Classes will end at the scheduled finish time, riders who have not shown by that time will not be allowed to show.

**Footing:**

All rings are sand with decomposed granite base

**Time Allowed:** The speed at which time allowed will be calculated will be 360 yards per minute for Pony Jumpers, and 382 yards per minute (350 meters per minute) for all other rated jumpers.

**ATTIRE:** In the following Special Classes, riders are required to wear black, dark blue, dark gray, dark green, or scarlet coats; white shirts with stock, tie, or choker; white, beige, or canary breeches; and black hunting cap.

**SCRATCHES:** Once nominated, the nominating fee is not refundable. The showing fee is not refundable if scratched the day of the class or after the Order of Go has been drawn, whichever comes first.

**MARTINGALES:** In any jumper class offering prize money of \$1,000 or more, only standing martingales or running martingales used in the conventional manner, are permitted. In any jumper class offering prize money of \$5,000 or more, or classes restricted to horses eight years of age or younger, only running martingales, Used in the conventional manner are permitted. Draw reins allowed when schooling or in classes offering less than \$1,000.

**AWARDS:** Winners to ride for presentation of awards in ALL Special Classes.

**COMBINING:** Management reserves the right to combine classes if there are less than 8 entries in any one class.

In all special classes, horses must be declared by 5:00 p.m. the day preceding the class. There will be no post entry penalty for special classes entered before 5:00 the day preceding the class. The order will be drawn and posted shortly thereafter. All horses that declare after 5:00 will be considered post entries and will go first in the order of go.

Life, Senior Active and Junior Active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above, and Combined Driving competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20. non-member registration fee and a \$5. breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: 1) Leadline; 2) Exhibitions; 3) Games and Races; and 4) Classes for 4-H Members; 5) Walk-Trot and Academy Classes (classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF Introductory Level Tests, Pas De Deux and Quadrille classes 7) NRHA endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) USEA Beginner Novice Divisions; 9) Assistant Handlers in Dressage Sport Horse breeding classes. Also exempted from this requirement are residents of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their National Federation.

**Exhibitors and Trainers please note:** Questions with regard to stall charges will not be considered after noon Friday of each show week.

a) Stalls, whether occupied by horses, feed, or tack, will be available for \$185 each week. First bedding will NOT be included. Portable stalls are 9'6" x 9'6" canvas with doors. **Stalls received after the closing date of entries will be \$200 each. Stall fees are not refundable under any circumstance.**

#### **b) EARLY STABLING:**

Limited Early stabling will be available beginning Saturday June 28th, 2008 for \$25 per night per stall. Early arrivals must call before June 15<sup>th</sup> to make arrangements – 818.563.3250 x 2.

#### **c) \*\*CIRCUIT STALLS\*\***

There are a limited number of permanent stalls (10 x 12) with sliding doors. These will be available on a first come, first served basis. These *Circuit Stalls* will be \$800 each, payable in advance and they are not refundable. Stalls may not be sold or given away any stall transaction must go through the horse show office. Management reserves the right to fill all un-occupied Circuit Stalls

#### **d) ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES**

Stalls will be available Monday, noon, and ending Monday, 9:00am, of each week. As stabling is limited, the Monday, noon move in/move out schedule will be strictly enforced. Horses will be admitted between the hours of 8:00am and 6:00pm. Anyone wishing to arrive at some other hour must make special arrangements. (before June 27) 818.563.3250x2, (after June 27) 818.679.5776.

#### **2. CHECK-IN:**

The Colorado Summer Circuit wants your entrance to the show-grounds to be quick and easy. You must check with the barn manager on duty to receive parking permits for RVs and owner/trainer/exhibitor parking. You will also receive instructions at this location regarding stabling assignments, trailer and truck parking and you'll be directed to a designated area. Your cooperation is necessary when parking trailers in order to accommodate everyone. Vehicles found in non-designated areas will be towed in cooperation with the Douglas County Sheriff.

### 3. PADDOCKS:

Turnout paddocks are on a first-reserved basis and must be paid for in advance on your entry blank. Monday morning to Sunday evening, for \$175 per week. Paddocks are steel pipe, dimensions approximately 24' x 24'. **Lock and chain are not provided for paddocks.** Horses found in paddocks which have not been reserved and paid for will be identified and the weekly paddock charge will be added to the owners account.

### 4. WASHRACKS:

Plenty of wash-racks are located west of the stalls and tents, adjacent to manure disposal area. HORSES MAY NOT BE TIED TO SPIGOTS, AND CHARGES FOR DESTRUCTION OF WATER LINES WILL BE ASSESSED FROM EXHIBITORS WHO DESTROY PIPES.

### 5. MANURE DISPOSAL:

A disposal system will be in place for your horse's manure. We expect exhibitors to bring manure to these sites, and not to place it in areas where it doesn't belong. These areas are located west of stalls and tents. Thank you in advance for your help in keeping the stable area clean.

### 6. MEDICAL WASTE:

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste. Bio Hazardous Medical Waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

### 7. MOTORIZED VEHICLES AND GOLF CARTS:

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. GR 1401.29.

### 8. ENTRY PROCEDURES:

**a.** For each horse entered, send a \$50 Entry Deposit Fee along with your \$185 weekly Stall Fee or Circuit Stall Fee, if Circuit Stalls have been ordered, as well as the appropriate nominating fees. **Weekly stalls received after the closing date of entries will be \$200 each.** Send with your completely filled out entry blank on or before the closing date of entries. Entries may be returned if any of the above is incomplete.

**b.** Bring a check for the remainder of your fees to the show. No numbers will be issued without full payment or a signed open check may be left.

**c.** If entry blanks are postmarked on or before the closing date of entries and are properly filled out the Entry Deposit Fee will be credited to the entries.

LATE ENTRIES AND/OR IMPROPER ENTRIES WILL FORFEIT THE ENTRY DEPOSIT FEE!!

**d.** DO NOT make entries from the time schedule. Consult the index to classes. Time schedules are subject to change after the close of entries. Therefore, upon arrival at the show, be sure to check the time schedule in the Horse Show Office.

#### **e. JUMPER NOMINATION FEES:**

Horses entered in any jumper class that does not offer prize money MUST pay a \$50 Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee.

Horses entered in any jumper class set at 1.30M or above MUST pay a \$125 Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$50 Entry Deposit Fee. GRANDPRIX horses must include an additional \$100 Grandprix Nominating Fee. Horses entered in the Grandprix ONLY are exempt from paying the \$100 Jumper Nominating Fee but they must send the Grandprix Nominating Fee of \$100. See the jumper division for further rules regarding the Jumper Nominating Fee.

#### **f. HUNTER/EQUITATION SHOWING FEE:**

Horses entered in any Hunter or Equitation class MUST pay a \$50 showing fee.

#### **g. EQUITATION ENTRIES:**

Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they are officially entered on. If the rider wishes to change horses for an equitation class, he/she may do so without penalty; however, the proper paperwork must be completed in the horse show office prior to the class. Exhibitors who enter an equitation class on one horse and ride or wear another horse's number will be charged on both horses. **Paperwork must be done in the horse show office to avoid this penalty.**

#### **h. HORSE RECORDING REQUIREMENTS**

Horses must be Recorded with USEF annually or for life in order to be eligible for HOTY awards and/or Zone awards, and to compete in jumper classes offering prize money.

Horses that are not Recorded with the USEF must have a USEF issued horse ID number.

#### **i. MEMBERSHIP**

Present to the show secretary or mail in with entries proof of current membership (USEF and USHJA), submit an affidavit affirming membership, or join at the show.

## 10. CHANGES PRIOR TO NUMBERS BEING ISSUED

Each week an exhibitor is allowed to make any class changes to an entry without penalty at the time the entry number is issued. This gives all exhibitors an opportunity to make adjustments to the original entry prior to picking up numbers. Once the entry number has been issued, the normal rules and fees to add and scratch classes will prevail. (The grace period applies only to class adds and scratches of "showing" horses and does not affect rules regarding stall fees, horse deposit fees, jumper nominations fees, post entry fees, show scratches, etc.)

## 11. POST ENTRIES:

**After a horses entry number has been picked up**, the post entry penalty of \$10 per class (\$25 for 'Special Classes) will apply with the exception of jumper declarations made by ½ hour after the last jumper class the day preceding the class added, providing that they have noted their sections on their entry blanks. **All entries received after closing date will pay a Late Fee of \$50 in addition to post entry penalties.** Horses and/or riders who go in a class without entering will be charged \$20 extra.

## 12. ADDS/SCRATCHES/CHANGES (without the official Show Vet Certificate)

1. Scratch Division – full credit if scratched prior to the start of the first class in the division, no credit if division has begun
2. Scratch Class – full credit if scratched prior to the class being held, no credit after class has begun
3. Show scratch –full credit for classes not ridden in less \$50
4. All classes (Hunter, Jumper and Equitation) scratched after the class has begun will not receive credit
5. There is no charge for exhibitors changing horses in an equitation class (see equitation entries for additional information)

## 13. REFUNDS:

Before the closing date of entries full refunds will be given. After the closing date of entries, ENTRY DEPOSIT FEES, NOMINATION FEES AND STALL FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED. After the show starts, with official show vets certificate only, full refunds will be given less a \$50 per horse "scratch fee", stall fees, and fees for classes already held prior to notification, whether exhibited in or not. If a division entry fee has to be pro-rated for a vet slip refund, the individual classes entered will be surcharged \$10 for each class in which the horse competed, in addition to the \$50 "scratch fee". Classes scratched after the order has been drawn will not be eligible for a refund.

## 14. TRANSFERS:

The transfer of horses and/or riders from one class or division to another will be allowed under the following circumstances:

- a. The Horse Show Office is notified the day before.
- b. Full credit will be given for the scratched class or division but post entries must be paid for all added classes.

## 15. SUBSTITUTIONS:

Under the same ownership, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse for an inclusive fee of \$50. (The scratched horse forfeits the \$50 entry deposit fee, the substituted horse pays no penalty).

## 16. NON-SHOWING HORSES:

A horse may be entered as "NON-SHOWING" on the original entry form at the time the entry blank is submitted by writing "non-showing" in the space where classes would normally be entered. An official "Non-Showing Horse" is required to pay a \$50 horse deposit fee and applicable stall fees. An official "Non-Showing Horse" who ultimately enters the horse show and competes is considered a post entry.

## 17. ORDERS OF GO:

All orders of go will be computer drawn. Horses entered after the order has been drawn may be required to go first.

## 19. ADD BACK MONEY:

In classes with add back, prize money is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses entered but not showing up will forfeit their add back money.

## 20. PRIZES:

All class winners will receive a trophy and ribbons through 8th place in addition to any prize money. Prize money will pay to 5th place; 30%, 25%, 20%, 15%, 10%. Excepting Special Classes - see specifications. Prize money checks will be made to the owner listed on the entry and will be mailed within 30 days after the show. **NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE MAILED UNLESS THE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OF THE OWNER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY BLANK.**

## 21. PRIZE MONEY – FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

**Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete form 8283 prior to prize money being issued.**

## 22. MINOR EXHIBITORS:

Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold The Colorado Horse Park, The Colorado Summer Circuit, The Colorado Hunter/Jumper Association, and Langer Equestrian Group, Inc. harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted unless a parent or guardian signs entry blank. The signature of instructors, agents or other unrelated persons will not be acceptable.

## 23. MANAGEMENT:

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or rising out of or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, change any course, cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; change rings or rotate judges; change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Once sections are combined, they will not be un-combined unless there are 8 entries in each section on the morning of the first class.

#### 24. TRAILER INS:

There will be a \$25 per day grounds fee for horses trailing in and not requiring stalls. Trailers may park only in designated day trailer parking. At no time may trailers be parked in the stable area, except for loading and unloading of horses and equipment.

#### 25. FEED AND BEDDING:

Hay, grain and bedding will be available at the Horse Show. The Colorado Horse Park is the feed/shavings concessionaire for the Summer Circuit. The feed/stabling office phone number is **303.841.3892**, Products will be sold at market prices. **To insure prompt delivery, please pre-order.** Those exhibitors who do not pre-order must present an open check to the feed office upon arrival. Orders will be totaled at the end of each week and must be paid in full at that time. A full line of quality feeds is available for your horse. **Deliveries from outside feed companies will not be allowed.**

#### 26. RV PARKING:

**There are a limited number of RV Hookups at The Colorado Horse Park.** They will be \$250 per week. Reservations must be made on the entry blanks and spaces will be available on a first-reserved basis, with Circuit reservations having priority. The stable manager will hand out RV passes. Each RV will be assigned a particular parking space. Your payment must be included with your entry and must be paid in full before you come on to the grounds with your self-contained units. ***Please note: Due to limited availability, RV reservations canceled after the closing date of entries will not be entitled to a refund. Exhibitors who reserve an RV space and cancel it after the closing date of entries will be responsible for the entire fee.*** Pumping service will be available, but must be scheduled with at least 24 hours notice. You must schedule your pumping in the Feed office.

**Fireworks of any kind are strictly forbidden anywhere within the boundaries of the Colorado Horse Park, including but not limited to: RV Parking Lot, Trailer Parking, Cross Country Course, Stable Area, Exhibitor Parking Lot.** Management reserves the right to bar any exhibitor found to be in violation from any further participation in the horse show without recourse to any refund of entry or stabling fees paid or due.

#### 28. DESIGNATED PARKING

- **Trailer Parking** South side of Bayou Gulch Rd., just west of the horse park entrance
- **Exhibitor Parking** West of the RV Lot
- **VIP Parking** VIP lot west of the Coles Arena
- **T sticker (trainer) Parking** T-Lot between the exhibitor parking lot and barn C

All trainers with 15 or more horses entered will be issued passes to park in the T-Lot. These passes will be issued on a first come first served basis, once the T-Lot is full additional parking will be in the exhibitor parking lot.

Absolutely no cars or trailers may be parked in the stable area except during loading and un-loading. Cars or trailers left unattended in the stable area will be subject to towing at the owner's expense. Vehicle traffic is a safety issue that we take very seriously.

**Disabled parking passes are available at no charge** in the horse show office, please call ahead in order to help us facilitate your entrance to the horse show grounds 303.841.7461.

#### 29. RETURNED CHECKS:

***Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure:***

All returned checks will be charged an additional 10% penalty (minimum \$50).

Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into the USEF for further disciplinary action.

#### 30. ARENAS:

Horses are not permitted in arenas when a course is set or in the process of being set for an upcoming class. Any horses entering a ring with a posted closed sign will be subject to elimination.

All warm-up and competition arenas contain sand with decomposed granite base. Warm-up arenas are approximately 150' x 200'.

Hunter arenas are approximately 150' x 290'. Derby field is approximately 200' x 400', Grand Prix ring is approximately 150' x 300'.

#### 31. SCHOOLING SUPERVISION:

Please be advised that starters have authority, as agents of management, to scratch riders who do not follow USEF schooling rules. We are serious about the rules for the schooling areas.

#### 32. COURSES:

Courses may consist of any combination of the following; Brush, Gate, Oxers, Post and Rails, Water, Liverpools, Ditch, Walls, Panels, Banks and Coops. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to adjust heights in Jumper classes as competition and or weather conditions warrant.

#### 33. CONFLICTS:

It is the intention of management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters so that they will not hold up a class. Starters have the authority from management to scratch riders who are not timely.

#### 34. DOGS:

All dogs on the show grounds must be leashed at all times. No dogs are allowed in stable area, in or around arenas or other areas, or in exterior RV areas without leashes. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. **See USEF GR1301.6**

Dogs are a serious safety problem at Horse Shows. All exhibitors should be advised that this show is SERIOUS about loose dogs being a nuisance at events and we encourage all persons to keep their dogs leashed and under control, for their safety ... and the safety of others.

**35. "AA" RATING:**

The guaranteed "AA" rating for the Circuit Opener, Rocky Mountain Classic and Co Summer Classic will be preserved even if classes and/or divisions are canceled. If additional prize money is necessary, it will be awarded to the 'A' rated hunter divisions in accordance with USEF rules.

**36. ABUSE:**

Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or penalties. Abuse includes, but is not limited to, excessive use of the whip and/or spurs, use of the whip in front of the horses shoulder.

**37. POLING:**

Poling and the use of Offsets **ARE NOT** permitted at any time, anywhere on the show grounds, during the Colorado Summer Circuit.

**38. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES:**

Please be advised that alcoholic beverages in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds.

**39. PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR:**

Except as may otherwise mandated by local law, the Federation strongly encourages all riders while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear protective headgear with harness secured which passes or surpasses ASTM SEI standarts for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor, to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, the Show Committee, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. See USEF GR318.

**41. DIRECTIONS TO THE COLORADO HORSE PARK**

**From Interstate 25:** Turn east on Colorado 470 - about 4 miles to Route 83, also known as Parker Road. Go South, through the town of Parker. Continue until you pass The Pinery on your left. High Prairie property begins at white fence just south of gate to The Pinery. DO NOT TURN INTO HIGH PRAIRIE. Continue through the light at High Prairie Drive and go to the next light which is Bayou Gulch Road. Turn left, pass Ponderosa High School, and you will see the show entrance on your left.

**From Interstate 70, Eastbound:** Take Colorado 470 (this exit occurs just as you have almost ended your descent through the foothills) until you reach Route 83 or Parker Road. Then follow directions listed above.

**From Interstate 70, Westbound:** Turn west on Route 86, just west of Limon. Go to Franktown intersection and turn north (left) at Route 83 or Parker Road. Travel approximately four miles and turn right on Bayou Gulch Road. The Horse Park will be on your left.
